- Consider the Annual Report of the General Committee
- Consider the Club Financial Statements
- Elect the officers and ordinary members of the General Committee
- Set the annual membership fees for 2016 2017 by setting the annual ordinary member subscription

• Any special business of which notice has been given in accordance with the rules (Club rules are on the website at Bendigo Yacht Club/Club information/Newsletter and Regulations).

## Election of 2016 -2017 office bearers and General members

All positions become vacant at the conclusion of the AGM. Officers and ordinary members of the General Committee are eligible for re-election.

#### Nominations are called for the positions of Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer and five Ordinary members of the General Committee.

All eligible members are encouraged to consider offering their services on the General Committee. Use the nomination form or get one from the club. Please consider supporting the Club in this way.

To be eligible for nomination, you must be a financial voting member of the Bendigo Yacht Club aged 18 or over as at 1 May 2016 and have been a yachting club member for at least 12 months. There are also some requirements about boat ownership and / or sailing experience and years of membership if you are less than 23 years of age (see rule 34(3).

## Bendigo 2016/2017 Notice of Special General Meeting

As a part of the AGM, 29 May 2016, at the BeYC Clubhouse

Dear Members

At the forthcoming Annual General Meeting notified in the April Mainsheet, a Special General Meeting will also be conducted to consider some proposed changes to the Rules of Incorporation.

Three (3) motions will be put forward involving the changes described:

## First alteration – simplify the process of accepting new members

This proposal removes the 7 day notification period on the notice board of a pending new member, thus allowing the General Committee to determine if the prospective member is suitable to join the club. It also accepts prospective member once he/she has paid.

It will be moved that the alteration described in the Notice of Special General Meeting to simplify the process of accepting new members be adopted.

#### Second alteration – simplify membership categories

This proposal clarifies some of the membership categories. Elements include:

- 1. Identifying Veteran and Intermediate members within the classification Ordinary Members with full rights.
- 2. Allowing the General Committee some latitude in setting fees for Family Members and Junior members.
- 3. Extend voting rights to Family Members 18 24 years incl.
- 4. Absorb Cadet Members into the category of Junior Members.
- 5. Absorb Sailability Members into the category of Special Members.
- It will be moved that the alteration described in the Notice of Special General Meeting to simplify membership categories be adopted.

## Third alteration – formally introduce the "Code of Conduct" to the Rules

This proposal formally includes a reference to the BeYC Code of Conduct It will be moved that the alteration described in the Notice of Special General Meeting to formally introduce the "Code of Conduct" to the Rules be adopted.

Notification has been sent to all members with documents attached to assist in the understanding of all this.



Bendigo Sailing Cruisers DOI Sheet The Journey Myall Lakes Cruise Part 1

As has been mentioned before, part of the fun of a cruise is the journey. With the trip to Tea Gardens - our set off point for the Myall Lakes cruise - this was certainly true. Although in some cases, fun may not have been the right word.

For this trip our cruisers came from almost all points on the compass - from the north, south east, due south and south west. The Coulson's with *Shamrock* in tow, made the short hop - a mere two hours - from North Haven near Port Macquarie where they had spent Easter with the family. The "Goodies" and *Bumblebee* came from Paynesville where they had been on baby sitting duty. John and Jenny Lockie with *Arakana* and Kevin Long and *Freewind* came up the Hume. Warren Matheson with *Gracenote*, Brian and Merilyn Coman with *The Guv'ner General* and Rob Heath with *Flying Circus* all had an aversion to Sydney traffic, and made the decision to leave a day early and drive up the Newell through Dubbo and then cut across to the coast.

#### "You take the high road and I'll take the low " - so goes the old Scottish song. In this case the low road was: The Newell Hwy - Gracenote, The Guv'ner General & Flying Circus.

Leaving Bendigo early on Easter Monday, our intrepid inland travellers enjoyed a leisurely drive up the Newell and found their way to Narrandera, although Warren and Brian had difficulty finding the Lake Talbot Caravan Park. Sat-nav devices on BOTH cars



kept sending the drivers in circles, however, good old Google Maps saved the day and a very pleasant night was spent at the park. Amongst the guests were a group of hot rod enthusiasts with all sorts of vintage and hotted up cars. These were very impressive and created quite a bit of interest.

We had just spent a glorious 4 days at Gippsland Lakes and on the Tuesday were heading directly up to Myall Lakes to join the other Bendigo Cruisers. We were going to do the trip in a leisurely 2 days, so started with a leisurely breakfast before starting our 6 hour trip from Paynesville to Gunning via the Monaro Highway - a part of Victoria neither Greg nor I had travelled. Our ETA to Gunning was 5.00pm.... Just in time to settle in and head to the Pub for a meal.

About 90 minutes into the trip and a bump in the road meant we had to alter our plans. A couple following us had alerted us to the problem. A brace holding one of the trailer springs had broken and one tyre had started to rub on the mudguard. Greg did some makeshift repairs (MacGyver would be proud) while I rang around to find someone with a welder. Not an easy feat in the middle of nowhere. But country hospitality saved the day. We limped back to Orbost where we were able to get it repaired. Thanks heaps to Orbost Tyres.

Back on the road - New ETA 10:30pm. But we had not allowed for shitty weather. Rain and fog meant the going was slow.
