Manager's Report

Anita Hunter -

Sponsorship, Partnership, Fundraising

Now memberships for the club have reached over 200 and the lake's water levels are peaked at the start of the season, the focus is moving to growing future sponsorship and strengthen club partnerships. In recent years, the club successfully gained sponsors to assist financially with the purchase of the training Pacers for sailing school that continue to prove to be a great asset for club. Our future depends on attracting new members, and with learn to sail courses to develop new skills, it is the best introduction to sailing. The club has already had several large group bookings this season using the facilities during the week for sailing with schools. Given this is an excellent revenue raiser, a venue hire booking form has now been developed to allow hire of the club and training boats with standard pricing and conditions of use available on our website. Allowing hire of the club to future corporate groups and sponsors as part of a package would be another opportunity of introducing new visitors to discover the club.

Sponsor package offers will be developed for a variety of corporate organisations to showcase the benefits of being involved with our club. Over the next month the General Committee will consider these packages and then have them available early in the new year. It is envisaged the packages would be transparent and allow club members to actively seek sponsors from their own networks and corporate connections with a range of package offers to attract sponsors. For a sponsor, we would consider the best opportunities to be provided by the club with benefits including advertising in our monthly newsletter, signage at the club, logo on Pacer sail (one space left), venue hire of club for training programs, product giveaways for prizes/raffles, club hats or special invitation to a sponsor's trophy race. If you have an idea or would like to get involved, I welcome your input to develop a successful club sponsors package.

Registrations for the sailing school have successfully been online this season and now offer payments through the Australian Sailing portal. In the coming months, this will become an improved system to fix the past issues and allow greater use to set up preregistration for regattas and potential to join the club online therefore a quicker process for new member application. Having over 50 people experience sailing, most for the first time, and seeing the smiles on faces, really made the day a great success. Interesting to note, the most common comment from many on the day was that they didn't know the club was here!



With 50% of participants who preregistered to our event through the Australian Sailing helped the day get off quickly. The registration desk was busy and we had a mix of responses to how they heard about the event including on the community calendar that was given 3BO and TV coverage, media release to papers, flyer promotion in school newsletters plus the Bendigo Show and the club's event on Facebook had all been seen, although our biggest promotion for the event were our club members who spoke to friends and family and invited them to the day. Well done on a great team in increasing the club's profile and spreading the message the club is here.

Post event, a follow up email was sent to all participants inviting them for a return visit and information on how to join the club and learn to sail programs.

Congratulations to the 18 sailors who graduate on Saturday 10 December from Start Sailing 1 and Start Racing courses. Saturday mornings, the club's Pacers and Optis are launched with the rescue boats and head out for some on water training after the theory lesson. Our groups have both been a good mix of adults and children with one or two other family members learning together.

Given we had a couple of adults withdraw from the course as they weren't interested to join the club and have passed this feedback onto the General Committee to consider offering a membership that would cover them for a short duration while they undertake the course and then if interested to continue, the initial payment could then come off the full fee. It's also worth noting that not everyone now is wanting to be involved in a club, they just like the opportunity to learn a new skill. The idea is being explored for next season.

The club has a fantastic team of volunteer instructors and assistant instructors that we rely on to deliver these programs. Their enthusiasm and professionalism is outstanding. Thanks to Doug, Johnny, Mick, Alyssa and Campbell. The families who help the kids with boat launching and packing up this season has been a great help too. In Search of a Sailfish

The year was 1956. Melbourne was still caught up in the excitement of the Olympic Games and television was new to homes in Australia. But at that time two young men, both keen dinghy sailors, had other things on their mind. They had designed the Australian Sailfish - a single hand centreboard dinghy..... A little 3.5 metre yacht that could be loaded onto the roof of a car or onto a trailer with ease. These men, Bruce Scott and our own Jack Carroll, developed the Sailfish for their own sailing pleasure and when they launched the first two boats at Parkdale Yacht Club on Port Phillip Bay they had no idea of the interest that these boats would create.

The Sailfish Association was formed in 1961 and by 1968 National Titles were being held in Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland. The seventies and early eighties were the boom time for the Sailfish with strong club representation in Victoria and New South Wales and active involved Associations in both states. By the late eighties though both associations had ceased to operate, and the Sailfish dropped from sight at the many clubs that had been their home.

A group of Sailfish enthusiasts are working to draw out boats and skippers from wherever they have been hiding themselves for the last few decades. These enthusiasts will be attending the Inverloch Classic Wooden Boat Regatta in January, as will class founder, Jack Carroll, and there is a website that is already helping to promote the class again.

BeYC was once a bastion of the Sailfish class and perhaps we still have some ex Sailfish sailors at our club. Maybe there is a Sailfish under a house or hiding in the rafters of a garage somewhere that could possibly be salvaged and restored. Jack's original Sailfish, *Debonair*, has been restored and last year won the "Best Presented Sailing Dinghy" at Inverloch's Classic Wooden Boat Regatta and will be back again in 2017.

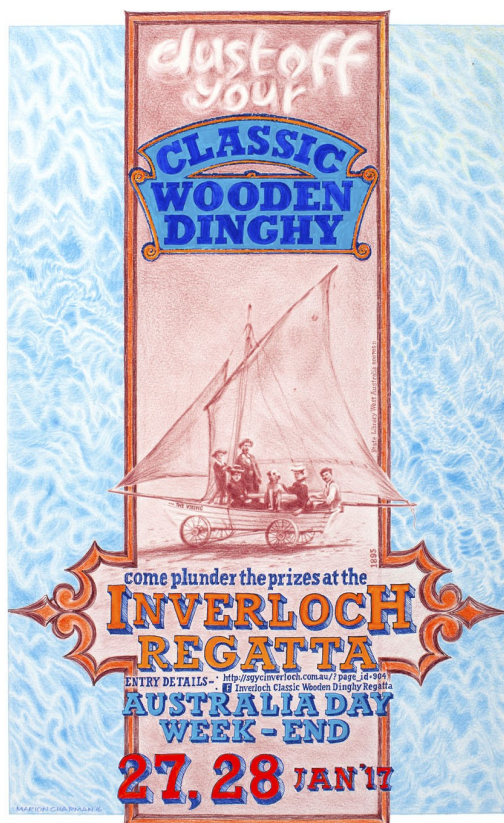
