
Membership NULUTIWAW You should have all received membership renewals by email or by snail-mail. These should now be paid.

Why Register Online ????

1. <u>myClub Registration Form</u>: The main benefit of using an online form in the myClub database is that members will be automatically covered by the <u>Australian Sailing Personal</u> <u>Accident Insurance Policy</u>. Other advantages of using an online registration form via myClub include:

• **Administration Efficiency:** members are automatically made 'active' in the Australian Sailing database when they complete an online form – no double handling of data where member information needs to be manually input into myClub.

• **Membership Payment/Fee Collection:** online payment options can be made available to members via credit card or EFT. Online payment can be made compulsory or optional – your members can register online and pay via another (offline) method.

• **Data Quality:** by enabling members to self-register online the quality of member data will improve.

• **Customisation:** any details you require from your members can be collected via the online form. Custom fields unique to your club can be set up and reported on in myClub.

• **Easy Reporting:** membership and financial reports can be easily generated (and saved). Reports can be displayed online or generated as excel files. All information collected on registration forms can be included in reporting.

Using the online form in myClub to collect club membership will save time and reduce the burden of membership related administration tasks.

Members are reminded that to continue to be covered, they must be entered in myClub prior to 1 October 2017.

On a 'nearly-full' Lake Eppalock on the Saturday of August 26, a fleet of five boats, all 'single handers', took to the water to sail the last race in the Club's 2017 Winter Series.

During this 'off-season'. races are held on the last Saturday of the month. Conditions were pleasant but challenging, with a light north-westerly wind fluctuating in direction and intensity, and sometimes it would die out altogether when the boats approached the buoy near the western shore. So sailing had its challenges and frustrations.

During the racing time Russell Denholm sailing an Impulse completed five laps, as did Hugh Ables sailing his Alpha Omega catamaran. Alyssa Hunter sailing a Laser 4.7 and Paul Cooper, sailing an Impulse for the first time, achieved personal bests by both completing four laps, while Alan Beavis, sailing a slower Sabre yacht, completed a very creditable three laps.

The Cruising Group are just back home after the long anticipated Sydney Harbour cruise. Four boats took part in the excursion, the Coulsons in *Shamrock*, the Heaths in *Sea Sharp*, the Comans in *Guvner General* and Warren Matheson and Kevin Long in *Knot at Work*. The last-named is a new acquisition by Warren – a twenty-six foot Macgregor.

The trip to Sydney was uneventful, although the last twenty kms or so took us off the Motorways on to busy suburban streets, and navigating through the traffic had its moments. We launched in the upper reaches of Middle Harbour, at the Roseville boat ramp in Garigal

National Park. This is a very pretty spot, with plenty of trailer parking.

Leaving the boat ramp on Monday morning (4th September), we made our way down towards the Spit Bridge, exploring as we proceeded. Winds were in the order of 20 knots and, discretion being the better part of valour, we used motors only. On the first night, we were fortunate to find a number of public moorings in a delightful and sheltered little cove, close to an old naval/military storage facility.



On the Tuesday morning we were underway in time to reach the Spit Bridge at about 10.15am where, having made prior arrangements with the bridge-master, a section of the bridge was lifted to let us through. The wind was still at about 20 knots but a couple of us tried a headsail for a little while. We soon abandoned this in favour of the motor.

Surprisingly (to us, at any rate) the trip across the Heads into the main harbour was reasonably smooth. Seas were below 0.5m and the strong westerly actually counteracted the expected ocean swell. Very soon, a forest of masts in the distance indicated that we were approaching Rushcutters Bay and the headquarters of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia (CYCA). This was to be our base for the next three nights. With some trepidation, we found our allotted berths amongst the huge keelboats of the moneyed classes. Warren had a slight altercation with the protruding anchor of a nearby keelboat and, for a little time, we considered renaming his boat *Knot at Peace*. Our puny boats (yes, even Warren's) were dwarfed by these sleek giants, all polished stainless steel and gleaming fibreglass. This, after all, is the home port of the Sydney to Hobart race. We felt a bit like the members of the Geebung Polo Club, down for a game with the "Cuff and Collar" team. But, I have to say, we were made to feel welcome and the excellent facilities were put at our disposal. Meals at the CYCA restaurant were reasonably priced, as indeed, were the berthing charges. How nice it was to have a hot shower at last, amongst such salubrious surroundings.

Given that high winds were forecast for the rest of the week, Rear Admiral Coulson (after due consultation with Jenny) decided that we ought to explore Sydney via the ferries rather than attempting negotiate the Harbour in our own boats. This was a good call, as temporary berthing/mooring is in short supply and the Harbour is always busy. We were able to catch a ferry at Double Bay – only about a kilometre's walk from the CYCA – and then proceed to Circular Quay where we could board ferries to all



locations around Sydney. This we did, visiting Manly (and a stroll to the beach, of course), Parramatta, Darling Harbour and many other localities. At Circular Quay itself, a giant cruising ship was in port and we were all impressed by its massive size when viewed at close quarters.

We spent quite a bit of time at Darling Harbour, exploring the National Maritime Museum. Here we were able to board the *Endeavour* replica and check out above and below deck. We also took a tour of HMAS *Vampire*, the last of the so-called "Big Gun" destroyers. We also ducked and crawled our way through the submarine HMAS *Onslow*. Some of us also went aboard the *James Craig* - the only 19th Century barque left in the Southern Hemisphere. This ship has been beautifully restored and is a fully-operational 'tall ship'. Thinking of my own problem in handling just two sails, I am in awe of those sailors on the *James Craig* who might have 21 sails aloft!



Each evening, the "happy hour" took place aboard the spacious *Knot at Work*, where the full cruising group could sprawl out with ease. On the final evening, we enjoyed a dinner at the CYCA restaurant and made plans for the return across the harbour next morning. To avoid delays at the Spit Bridge, we took down our masts before leaving the CYCA and returned under motor. Again, the seas were quite moderate, despite strong winds. We were back at our initial launch point by midday and Warren and Kevin decided to head home immediately, whilst

Coulson's headed further north to visit family and to be re-united with their dog, Paddy. Heaths and Comans stayed at the launch point until very early next morning, leaving just after daybreak to avoid the heavy road traffic.

All in all, a very pleasant trip. For this writer, at any rate, it was my first time on Sydney Harbour and I was impressed not only by the vast expanse of water, but also the efficient ferry service and by that peculiar mixture of sandstone and bushland that characterises so much of the steeper shoreline. Thanks again to Ken and Jenny Coulson for organising such a memorable trip.
